


PATIENT ASSISTANCE FUND

The Patient Assistance Fund plays a vital role in patient support by supplying funds for transportation, gas, prescriptions, and housing. This fund helps to alleviate hurdles that may prevent those in need from receiving treatment and post-treatment care. Since the campaign began in Spring of 2024, over \$4.900 has been raised.

An exciting part of this campaign includes a quarterly activity called "Fun Top Friday," a day when employees who make a donation can wear their tie-dyed Patient Assistance shirt (see picture below), or another fun top, rather than the standard scrub top or business casual shirt. These days have helped create a sense of unity and boost morale throughout the hospital, and have increased employee donations to the fund. You may also see the Patient Assistance logo on badge reels worn by employees throughout the year. Watch for employees "Spreading the Sunshine" next time you are in the hospital!

While many who donate to the Patient Assistance Fund are IMH employees, anyone can participate and support this cause. We are excited to continue growing this project and expanding our donor base throughout the community. This fund provides support when it is needed most, helping to smooth the process as patients discharge from IMH.



Supporting IMH EMPLOYEES

EMPLOYEE WELLNESS

The Employee Wellness Fund is available for IMH employees to use when participating in a variety of fitness activities. Employees have received awards from this fund to help cover registration costs for bike races, 5K events, marathons, Tough Mudder races, and other sporting events. The Run For Your Life (R4YL) 5K/2K run/walk is hosted by Ivinson each year in early June, with proceeds from the race supporting the Employee Wellness Fund. This account is primarily funded by IMH employees, for IMH employees.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Award for Professional Development was established through the combination of the Sandy Joy Scholarship, Kris Kramschuster Scholarship, Employee Education Scholarship, and Inge Townsend Nursing Scholarship funds. The goal of this scholarship is to develop a sustainable award program that promotes employee professional development.

CLASSROOM TO CAREERS PROGRAM In 2023, the IMH Foundation committed \$100K in support of the *Classroom to Careers* project, a recruitment program offering \$5K-\$10K in financial assistance to students across disciplines and institutions. This project has allowed IMH to partner with educational programs to serve as clinical capstone sites when possible, and to create a smooth transition into employment at IMH. Over the two and a half years this program has been in place, fifteen students have been accepted into the program and received education financial assistance. This program has helped increase staffing of critical roles in nursing and ancillary services, and has provided an opportunity for students to learn more about the IMH facility, encouraging a longer term commitment into permanent positions.

FOUNDATION FUNDING REQUESTS

Each year, IMH departments submit funding requests to the IMHF Funding Committee for equipment and special projects. These requests may include unexpected purchases not included in the standard IMH budgeting process, equipment upgrades, advanced education and training, or any request intended to improve patient experiences at IMH. For the past several years, the Foundation has awarded up to \$100K annually to departments. In FY25, the committee awarded funding to 8 department projects.

The IMHF Funding Committee is made up of Foundation board members from different backgrounds and disciplines who review and score the applications after thorough deliberation.

HIGHLIGHTED PROJECTS

DIALYSIS: WEDGE CUSHIONS FOR IV INSERTION

"These wedges have greatly helped our unit by providing extra comfort for our patients. They have made a difference by increasing patient satisfaction. It also helps staff because these are very easy to clean in between patients. Patients sit in their dialysis chair for 3-4 hours 3 times a week. They have large needles in their arm and cannot move their arm during treatment. This provides them more support for their arm and more comfort as they can keep their arm closer to their body versus using the arm rest of the chair. Additionally, resting the patients arm on this wedge makes it easier for both staff and patients."

OUTPATIENT REHABILITATION: SCIFIT PRO 2 TOTAL BODY MACHINE

"The SciFit Pro 2 Total Body Machine has been a valuable addition to our clinic, enhancing both therapeutic outcomes and operational efficiency. It has allowed our therapists to deliver more targeted, full-body rehabilitation programs while reducing the need for multiple pieces of equipment. For patients, it has provided a safe, versatile platform to improve strength, endurance, and mobility, all within a single session. Our outpatients use the total body workout machine for a variety of rehabilitation and fitness needs, including postoperative recovery, injury prevention, balance training, and general conditioning. Its adaptability makes it suitable for individuals at different stages of recovery, allowing us to tailor programs to meet specific therapeutic objectives. Integrating this machine into our practice has enhanced the quality of care we provide. It supports evidence-based treatment plans and aligns with our commitment to delivering efficient, patient-centered therapy. We look forward to expanding



its use and continuing to explore innovative ways to support our patients' recovery and long-term wellness." —KIM TAYLOR, REHABILITATION SERVICES MANAGER



GOLDEN KEY CLUB

The Golden Key Club recognizes donors who have made significant contributions to the Ivinson Memorial Hospital Foundation. Membership in the Golden Key Club is extended to individuals and businesses who have reached a high level of lifetime giving combined with yearly donations.

The Golden Key Club is comprised of some of the Foundation's most generous and consistent donors. Over the years, their contributions have directly helped to improve our community and have grown the Foundation into a successful fundraising organization.

To show appreciation, in November 2024, the Foundation hosted a Golden Key Club dinner at Black Fox on Welsh Lane. Members of the Foundation's Board of Directors, and Honorary and Emeritus Directors were also invited to the event, which served as a meaningful opportunity to thank them for their continued support and to celebrate the impact they have had on the Hospital's success. At the event, a virtual tour of the newly renovated Emergency Services Facility project was presented. It was exciting to see how much work had been done following a very successful fundraising campaign for the project.





GIVING TREE

During the holiday season, the Foundation collected and distributed almost 450 items including toys, children's clothing, and food items, which had been generously donated by IMH employees, Foundation Board members, and members of the Laramie community. The donated gifts were distributed to IMH families in need of extra assistance. In December of 2024, the Giving Tree supported 23 families with a total of 19 food baskets and gifts for 70 children.

The annual Giving Tree effort is led in collaboration with IMH Social Worker Janae Vessely and the Foundation staff. Ornaments are placed on the tree in the west atrium of the hospital in late November. IMH Employees and community members wishing to be a "Secret Santa" can take an ornament with a specific gift or food request, buy and wrap the items requested, and return the gifts to the Foundation Office in December. During this time of year, gifts and food baskets fill the Foundation Office. This effort truly shows the generosity of our community to give back to employees experiencing hardship.



MEREDITH AND JEANNIE RAY CANCER CENTER


INFUSION ROOM PROJECT

The IMH Foundation has always supported the Cancer Center at IMH. It established a special fund, the "Ray of Hope" endowment to support the acquisition of linear accelerators, and has provided funding for general improvements to the overall convenience within the Cancer Center, including new infusion treatment spaces, furniture, and waiting areas.

In February of 2025, the IMH Foundation Board of Directors committed to supporting the Cancer Center Infusion Room Expansion as the next focus for fundraising. The Foundation set a goal of \$750K to be raised over the next two years.

This transformational project will expand treatment space to accommodate increased patient volume while preserving a healing, private environment for patients battling cancer. Throughout the renovation, the Cancer Center will remain fully operational.

HEALTH LINKS GOLF TOURNAMENT

The Health Links Golf Tournament is a lively fundraising tradition, that has now celebrated its 27th year. This 18-hole scramble brings members of the community together to compete for different prizes all in the good spirit of raising money for the Meredith



EMERGENCY SERVICES FACILITY EXPANSION AND RENOVATION PROJECT COMPLETION

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN RECAP

NEW AND IMPROVED EMERGENCY SERVICES SPACE

In May of 2022, a groundbreaking ceremony was held to kick-off the Emergency Services Facility Expansion and Renovation project. Total cost for this project was expected to be ~\$14 million. The IMH Foundation committed to raising \$4 million over a 5-year campaign, the highest-level capital campaign in the Foundation's history.

With the completion of the expansion and renovation project, the new IMH Emergency Department boasts a new entrance with a covered driveway, larger waiting room space, two-bay ambulance garage, and a centralized nursing station which allows a line of sight to their 13 new treatment rooms. Updates have also been made to create isolation capabilities through negative air pressure, and to enhance patient and staff safety.

The new facility better equips the Emergency Department staff in caring for a growing number of patients in need of emergency services. For patients, the improvements make an unwanted emergency room visit a little more comfortable.



HIGHLIGHTING MAJOR DONORS

PAUL G ETCHEPARE JR. WAITING AREA

Paul Etchepare was a longtime friend of the Foundation and member of the Foundation Board. He believed a strong hospital required state-of-the-art facilities and equipment, staffed by courageous people. Throughout his lifetime, Paul engaged with the needs of the Hospital, working to ensure the best equipment was available to the community he loved. Many years ago, Paul made a commitment to furthering the mission of the Foundation, naming Ivinson Memorial Hospital Foundation in his estate documents. Paul wanted to leave a legacy at Ivinson, and in Laramie, that would outlive him. The Foundation worked with the Hospital to

identify a project for Paul's gifts to be recognized, selecting the Emergency Services Facility expansion and renovation project. Upon completion of the project, Paul's name was placed above the fireplace in the new waiting room (see photo above). The Foundation and Laramie community admire Paul for his devotion to the Foundation, philanthropy, and the profound legacy he left for the future of Laramie.

BILL WERNER WINTER GARDEN

In the walkway between the new Emergency Department and the existing Ivinson Memorial Hospital entrance is a new area designed to provide a peaceful space for families to sit comfortability while staying close to the Emergency Department. Prominently placed on this wall of donors is Bill Werner's name. Bill is a long-time member of the Laramie community and a generous donor to the IMH Foundation. For several

years, Bill has served as the event sponsor for multiple Foundation fundraising events including the Sportsman Raffle and Health Links Golf Tournament. He has also donated to other fundraising events and supported projects and equipment purchases that have directly impacted IMH departments and made a significant contribution to the Emergency Services Facility Expansion and Renovation project.



DONOR SPOTLIGHT

Instrumental in the Capital Campaign supporting the Emergency Services Facility Expansion and Renovation project was long-time Laramie resident, real estate developer, and philanthropist, John Evans. Early in the campaign, John offered a gift with a matching opportunity for all donations made to the project. This generous gift encouraged community engagement and elevated the profile of the campaign. He requested dedication of the space be made in the memory of his late wife, Janey Hampton, stating, "This was Janey's legacy. She wanted to do something meaningful for the hospital, something that would last. I am very proud to see this project through and to know that Janey's giving spirit will continue to make an impact in the lives of others."

With the support from John, not only financially, but through his involvement in engagement opportunities where he spoke to members of the community about the importance of philanthropy and giving back to the community, the Capital Campaign exceeded its original fundraising goal in record time. The IMH Foundation completed the Capital Campaign efforts in December 2024, raising over \$7.5M towards the project.



DONOR RECOGNITION WALL

A donor recognition wall was designed in the Winter Garden Area of the newly expanded and renovated space near the entrance of the Emergency Services Facility. Donors listed on this wall gave a substantial amount to the Capital Campaign supporting the Emergency Services Facility Expansion and Renovation project. RIBBON CUTTING AND NAME UNVEILING

On June 4, 2025, a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony was held at the newly remodeled Emergency Services Facility at IMH. Among the speakers were Gary Crum, Chair of the IMH Board of Directors, member of the IMH Foundation Board of Directors, and Wyoming Senator; Doug Faus, IMH CEO; Dr. Nate Moore, an emergency department physician; and Shannon Polk, Executive Director of the IMH Foundation.

More than just a facility upgrade, the project reflects a deeper commitment to quality healthcare. Hospital leaders noted that the improvements not only meet the rising demands, but also support the skilled professionals who care for the community every day.

The naming of the new facility, "Janey Hampton Evans Emergency Services", marks the final step in a project that has transformed emergency care in Albany County and left a lasting tribute to a woman remembered for her warmth, grace, and desire to give back. "She was just one of those people who went out of her way to be kind," John said. "This was her wish, to make a lasting difference. And now, she has."


